

Eligibility for TIGP Student Dormitory Application

Eligibility and priority for the residency of the International Student Dormitory are stated below, respectively:

1. a matriculated TIGP student – when low in availability, the order of priority for residency is stated respectively as follows:

- (1) the first year foreign students;
- (2) the first year local students whose household registered address is more than 20km from the Academia Sinica;
- (3) the second year foreign students;
- (4) the second year local students whose household registered address is more than 20km from the Academia Sinica;
- (5) the third year foreign students;
- (6) a TIGP student whose status is excluded as stated above.

2. non-TIGP PhD students – when rooms are not fully occupied, vacancies will be open for application to the non-TIGP PhD students (both foreign and local) working in Academia Sinica; the order of priority for residency is stated respectively as follows:

- (1) a PhD student who's advisor is amongst the TIGP faculty
- (2) other PhD students working in Academia Sinica

3. Five rooms are reserved as guest rooms for TIGP-affiliated exchanged students and scholars.

4. An application will **NOT** be considered when the applicant is found to be:

4.1. infected with **Legal Contagious Diseases** listed below. (For further information, please visit the CDC website at <http://www.cdc.gov.tw>). Should an infection occurs after residency is granted, the Residence Committee reserves the right to re-evaluate or withdraw the residency, subjected to the seriousness of the issue.

4.2. diagnosed as psychologically unstable.

4.3. with severe criminal records

5. Should an infection occurs after residency is granted, the Residence Committee reserves the right to re-evaluate or withdraw the residency, subjected to the seriousness of the issue.

Legal Bases and Kinds of Notifiable Diseases

1. Legal bases: two, 1) Article 3 of the Communicable Disease Control Act;
2) Article 2 of the AIDS Control Act
